East Link Connections Project

Replaced Peak-Only Route 214 – Phase 3

Neighborhoods Served:

- Downtown Issaquah, Issaquah Transit Center, downtown Seattle

Summary of Proposed Changes:

- Revised Route 554 replaces Route 214 between Issaquah and South Bellevue Link Station.
- Link light rail replaces Route 214 between South Bellevue Link Station and downtown Seattle.
- New Route 203 also provides local service on the segment of Route 214 between Issaquah Transit Center and South Bellevue Link Station.

Why is this change being proposed?

- To create a more reliable connection between downtown Seattle, Mercer Island, Issaquah, and other eastside destinations.

How does this respond to feedback Metro received in Phase 1 and 2?

- High frequency at traditional peak commute hours.
- Improves connections to transit hubs.
- No changes being proposed from Phase 2.

* Frequent - The bus comes every 15 minutes or less during peak periods and every 30 minutes or less during off-peak periods.

- * Local – All-day bus service that does not meet the standard for frequent.
- * Peak-only – The bus comes only 5-9 a.m. and 3-7 p.m. These are the times of day Metro and Sound Transit sees the most riders, usually regular commuting times, Monday through Friday.
