) Re: Accessible Fonts and Typography

Purpose: To ensure access to justice for all and to comport with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ACA) requirements that text for printed and web-based communication be clear, readable and accessible for individuals with disabilities.

WHEREAS access to justice is a priority for King County District Court;

WHEREAS the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) serves to provide information and guidance regarding accessibility of written printed and web-based materials;

Therefore, it is now ORDERED:

1. King County District Court shall use fonts as recommended under the Americans with Disabilities Act on all printed and web-based materials on all newly created forms and web-pages.
2. King County District Court shall use font sizes as recommended under the Americans with Disabilities Act on all newly created forms and web pages.
3. King County District Court shall change all fonts and all font sizes on all forms and web-pages currently in use in order of priority as determined by the Forms Committee and as soon as the workload and budget of KCDC will allow.
