 Primary Contributing factors:  
 \* The State School total levy rate increased by approx. \$0.20 over last year.  
 Part 2 McCleary is exempt for qualifying senior/disabled citizens.  
 \* In 2023, King County voters approved a Crisis Care Center lid lift and a renewal of the Vets/HS/Srs lid lift, both of which are exempt for qualifying senior/disabled citizens.  
 \*The increases above were off-set by the largest reduction is SD 415 bond rate. The reduction in the bond rate is due to the district requesting less for their bond levy.  
 Increases in rates are typical when assessed values go down.

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
