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

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






#### Overlay of Rural Town Boundary




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


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
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
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Map Amendment 9: Vashon-Maury Island - Amend P-Suffix VS-P30




#### **Shoreline Stabilization**

What is shoreline stabilization? Methods to stop erosion along shorelines from tidal, wave, wind, or flood activity. This includes:

- Preventative measures (this is called nonstructural stabilization) like setting buildings further back from the water,
- Soft structural methods like vegetation or beach enhancement, or
- Hard structural methods like bulkheads.
   "Harder" methods have more negative impacts
   by interrupting ecological processes and
   degrading natural habitat.

The image to the right shows **soft stabilization in the foreground**, using vegetation and beach enhancement, as well as **hard stabilization**, **using a bulkhead**, **to the right**.



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
