#### **1. Call to Order**

Vice Chair John Rodriguez called the meeting to order at approximately 3:35 p.m.

#### **2. Meeting Minutes**

Consideration of the March 4, 2026 meeting minutes was deferred to a future meeting.

#### **3. Special Purpose District Elections Overview**

The workgroup received a presentation from Janice Case, King County Elections Deputy Director, regarding special purpose district elections. King County has over 190 special purpose districts for which Elections conducts elections under RCW 29A. There are some districts that fall under other code provisions, including drainage districts and the King Conservation District. Members asked several follow-up questions.

#### **4. Ongoing Discussion Regarding Previously Presented Topics**

The follow-up discussion on the Voter Education Fund and demographic data was postponed.

#### **5. Staff Updates**

Tania Mondaca, CEOC Staff, noted that there are two vacancies on CEOC. The King County Council extended the application deadline to April 21. The next CEOC meeting will take place in person at King County Elections on May 19.

Rodriguez opened the floor for further discussion on voter suppression issues. The federal SAVE Act was flagged for continued attention.
