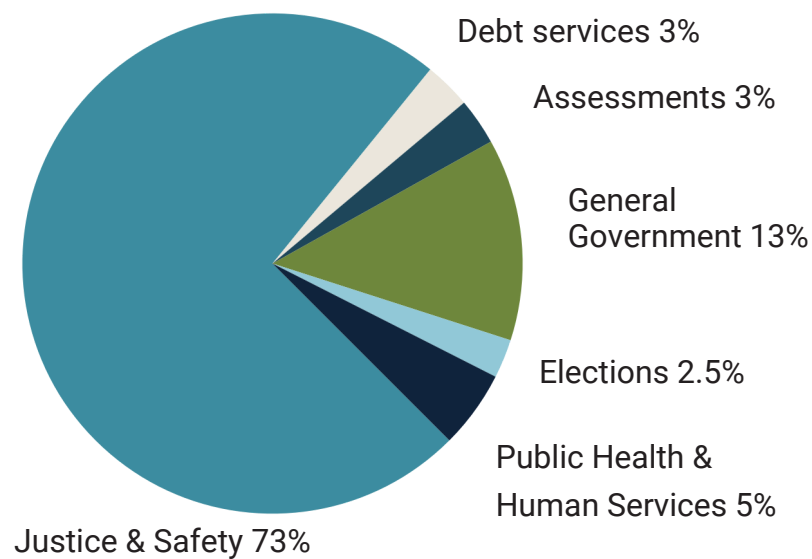

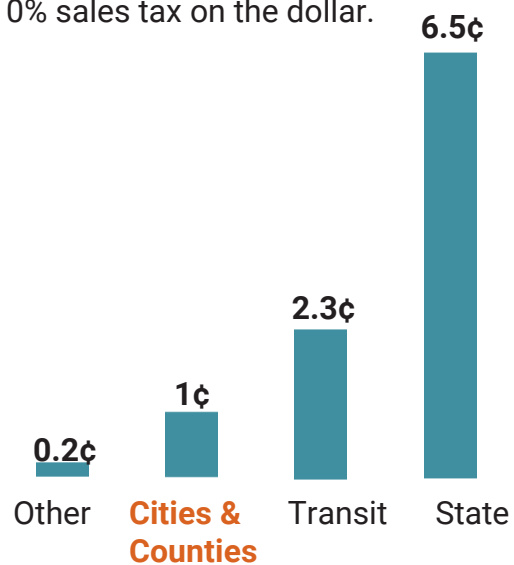

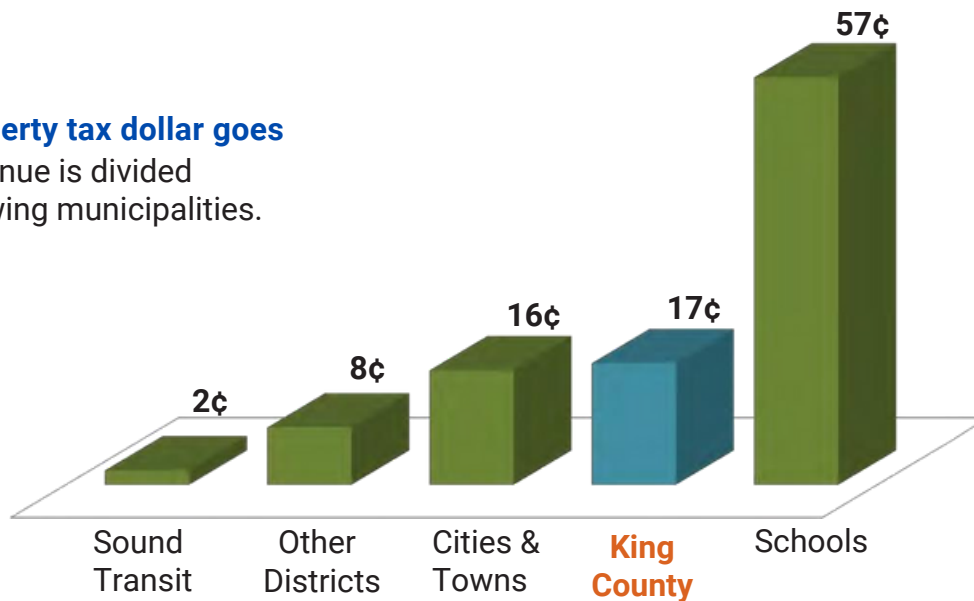
Where your sales tax goes

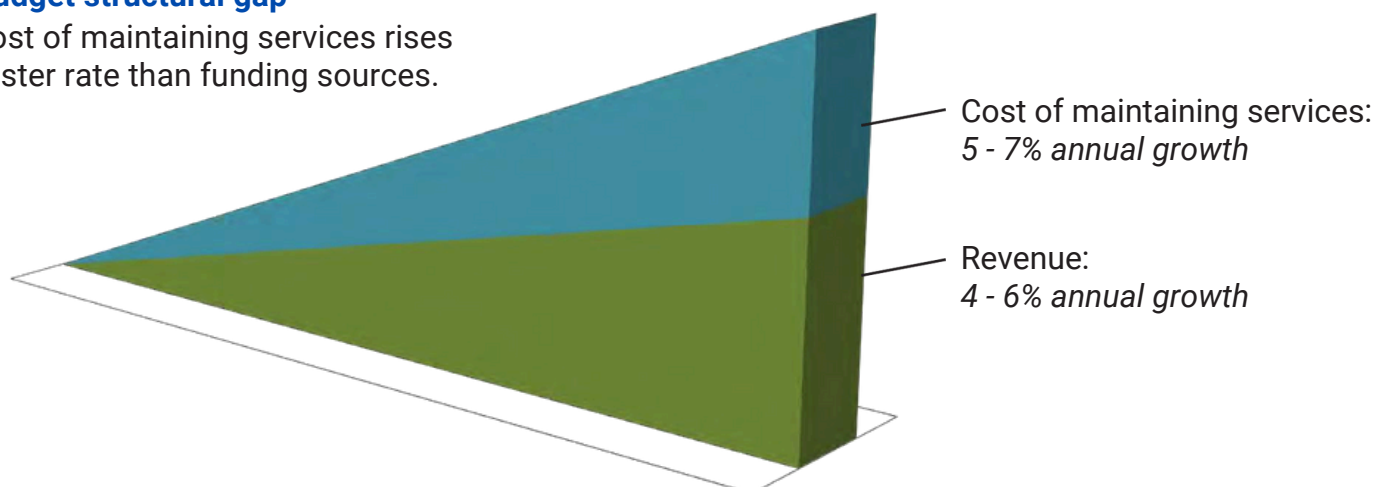
Where your property tax dollar goes

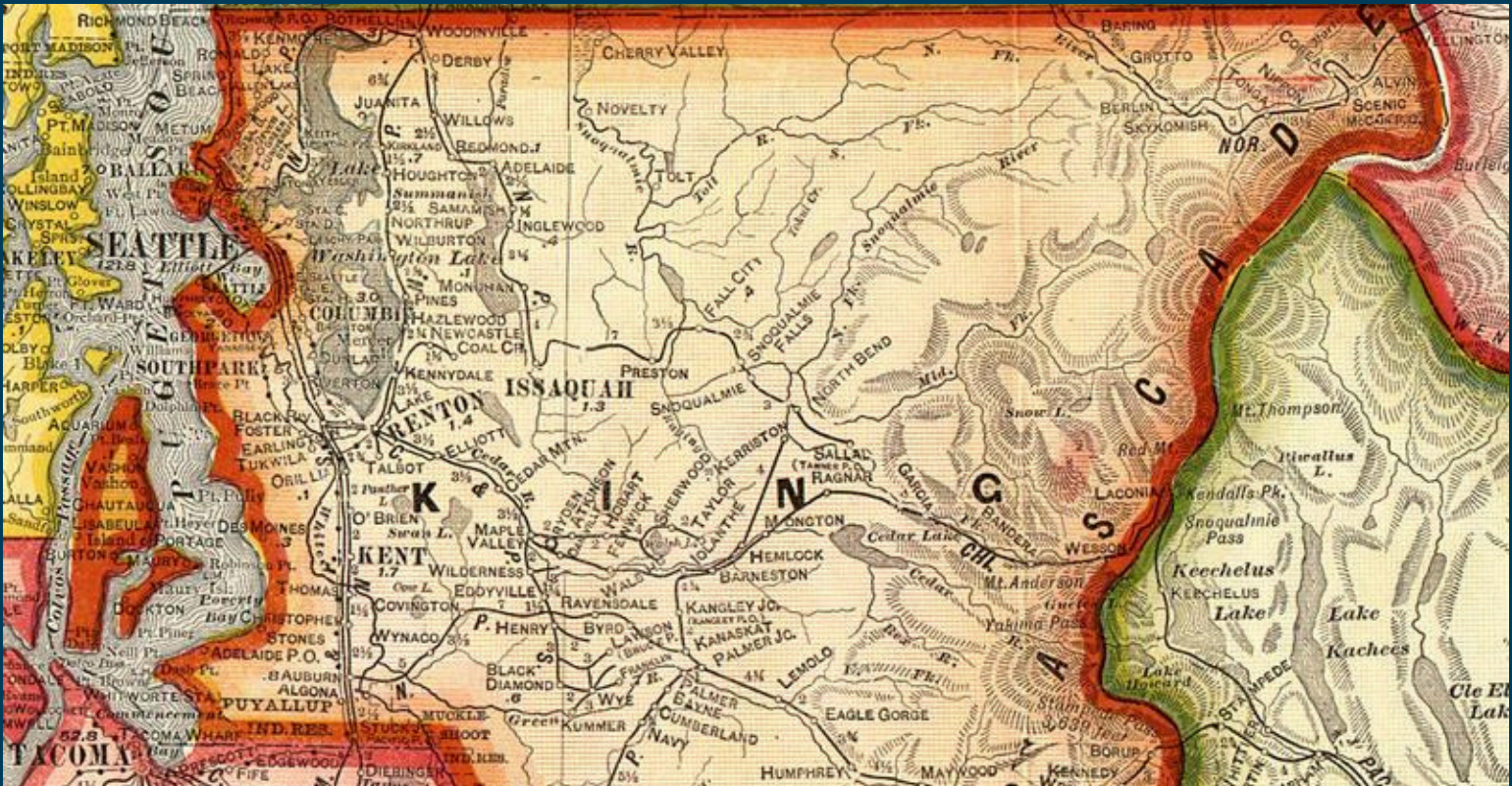
