## Maleng Regional Justice Center Veterans Program

KCVRP partners with the Maleng Regional Justice Center Veterans Program, a dedicated housing unit that brings incarcerated veterans together to build connection, camaraderie, and peer accountability.

KCVRP offers a bi-weekly resource and reentry group focused on preparing veterans for a successful return to the community. Participants also benefit from additional programming provided by jail partners, including health and wellness activities, emotional regulation and yoga, self-reflective writing, and other supportive services as available.



## Mission

The Veterans, Seniors, and Human Services Levy (VSHSL) is a critical funding source that supports services to improve overall health and well-being of priority populations, create thriving communities, and reduce disparities throughout King County.

King County Veterans Reentry Program (KCVRP) is a VSHSL-funded program that works with veterans incarcerated in King County to provide tailored connections to services that ease reentry – including support through the King County Veterans Program (KCVP) and King County's network of veteran service providers (including VSHSL-funded partners).
