Issues	Discussion
Welcome	Co-chair Steve Larsen welcomed everyone and shared a brief overview of the meeting agenda. The Co-chair requested attendees sign into the meeting using Zoom with their name and organization.
Public Comments	There were no sign-up requests for public comments to be made.
Executive’s Proposed MIDD 2025 Budget - Dwight Dively, Director, Performance, Strategy and Budget, King County Executive	<p>Larsen introduced Dwight Dively, Director of King County’s Office of Strategy and Budget. Dively presented several additional items proposed by the Executive’s Office for the 2025 MIDD budget:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Adult Drug Court Restitution Fund: \$100,000 to cover mandatory victim restitution costs for Drug Court graduates. 2. Community Court – Bellevue: \$91,000 for starting a Community Court program in Bellevue to reduce recidivism and increase access to services. 3. Strength at Home: \$100,000 for a pilot program to support individuals facing domestic violence charges. 4. Mental Health First Aid: \$146,000 to continue funding a one-time 2023-2024 program into 2025 to meet community demand for critical training. <p>Finegood asked if the "Strength at Home" program was eligible for funding, and Dwight confirmed that the prosecutor’s office deemed it acceptable.</p>
ACTION: 2025 Executive Budget Proposal Poll- Gretchen Bruce, MIDD Operations, BHRD	<p>Gretchen Bruce, MIDD Operations Manager, initiated the Budget Proposal Poll, with the Poll Question: Do you support the Executive's proposed additional 2025 MIDD budget items? All voting participants (100%) voted YES in support of the proposed budget items.</p> <p>Dively thanked everyone for their input, noting that the feedback will be considered in the executive decision-making process. He mentioned that discussions will continue, and the Executive’s budget is set to be released on September 24, 2024.</p>
Agenda Items for Next Meeting	Co-chair Larsen noted that at the upcoming September meeting, the advisory committee will be asked to provide input on the renewal of the MIDD behavioral health sales tax. Laura Smith, the MIDD Renewal Manager, and her team will lead a listening and engagement session similar to those being held in the community.
