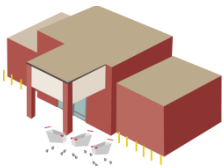

Service Type: Opioid Treatment Program

Capacity: 500 Outpatient Clients

Location: Kent

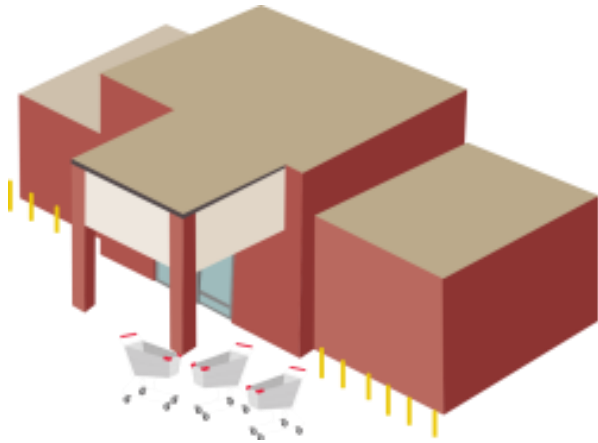
Opening Date: August 2016

County Investment: \$1,000,000

Why is this investment necessary? This program was added to address two issues, a lack of service capacity resulting in long waitlists and a lack of service providers in south King County, resulting in 500+ clients travelling to downtown Seattle for treatment.

Result: Waitlist nearly eliminated, Medicaid travel costs reduced, and expanded system capacity amidst opioid epidemic.

Swedish Ballard

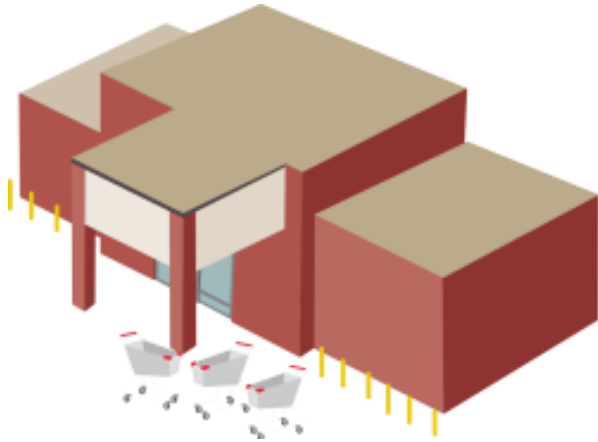

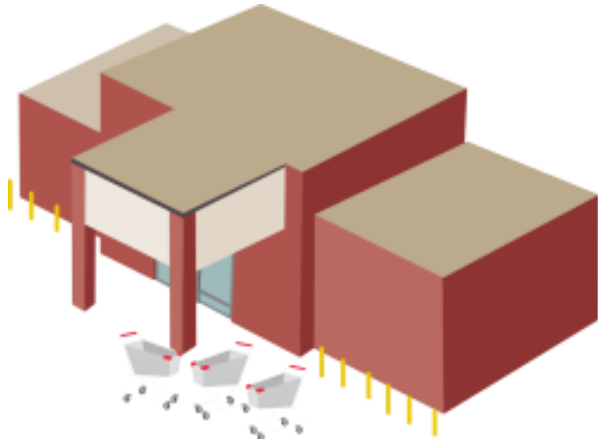

Why is this investment necessary? Geriatric patients with dementia or Alzheimer's disease are often detained in the mental health system. We need a treatment option designed to meet the additional needs of these patients and their families.

Result: More appropriate patient placement will result in better outcomes, and a new facility will increase system capacity.

Telecare



Service Type: Evaluation and Treatment

County Investment: \$3,231,000

Why is this investment necessary? This program was added to address a lack of system capacity that has resulted in patients not receiving psychiatric services in an environment of care conducive to recovery.

Expected Result: Treatment on demand for psychiatric patients needing hospitalization in an appropriate setting.

Service Type: Co-occurring Residential

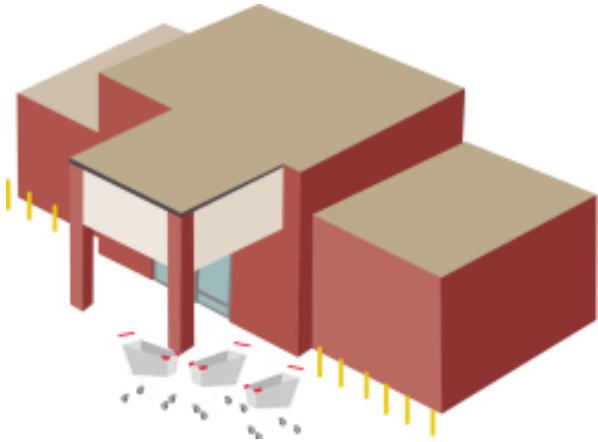
