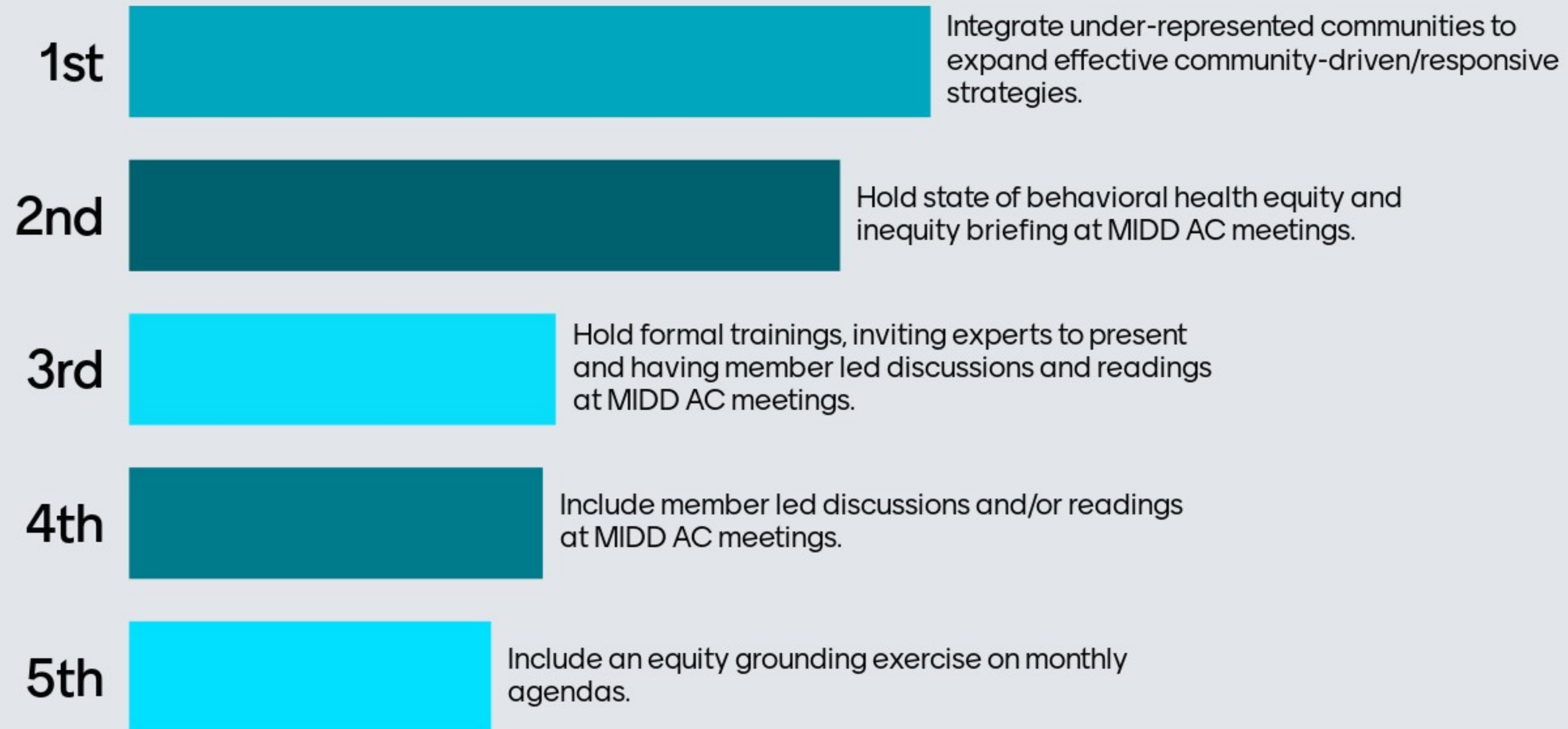

Review and assess equity opportunities in MIDD programs, services, and operations.

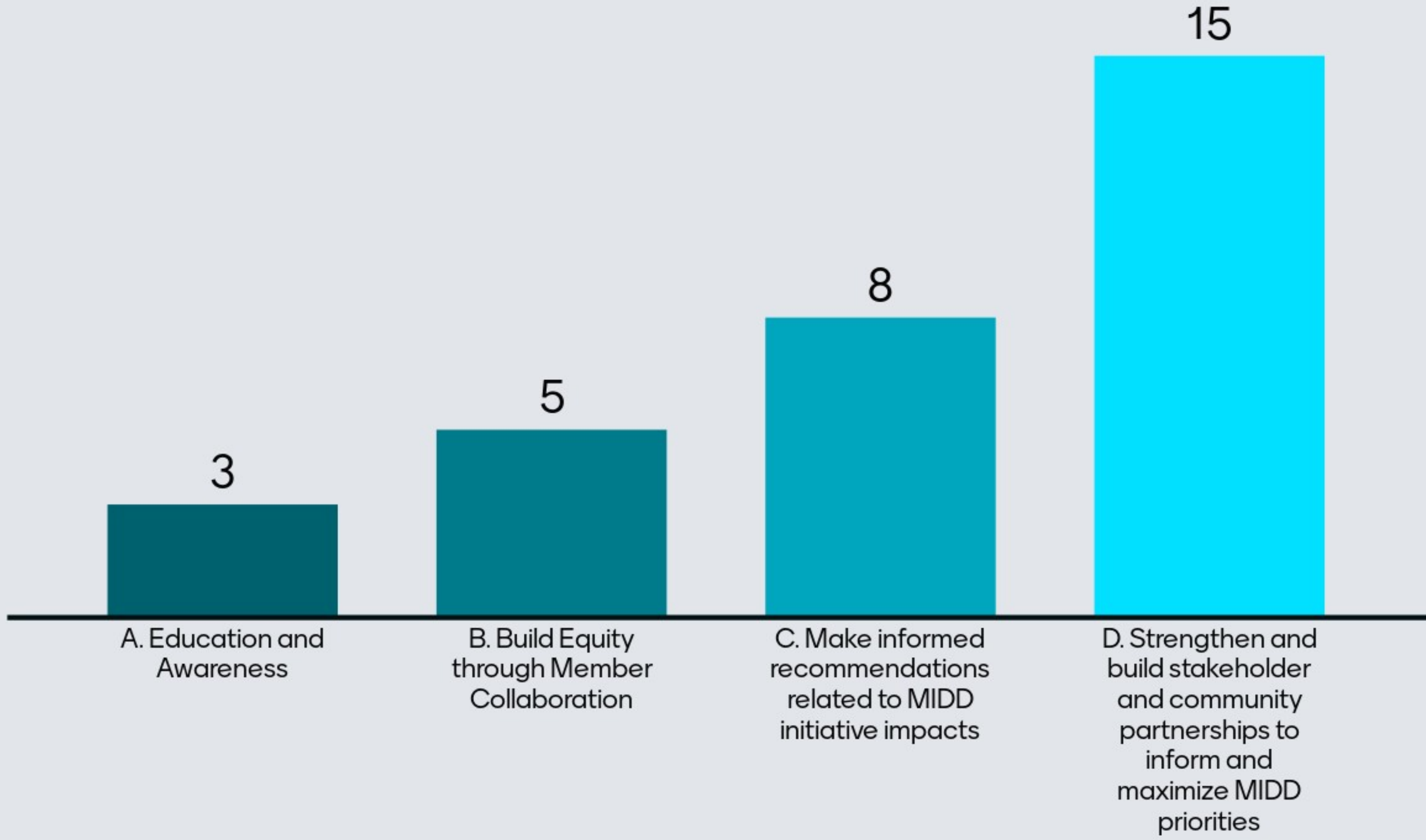
4th

War on Drugs

Consumer / peer voices

Restorative justice

Assess regional access to behavioral health

Dismantling court-based solutions to behavioral health problems. Supporting community-based, non-coercive interventions.

Data and evaluation

Alternatives to police/criminal justice involvement. Supporting access to behavioral health during times of community crisis (like the pandemic), especially for communities that have barriers to treatment access

Treatment instead of confinement

Moving from rhetoric to action
