Projects included fencing, decking, roofing, windows, flooring, electrical, and plumbing. Wide geographic spread for projects. Before and after project stories were told, and pictures shared. Discussion: High demand stood out to PAS members: Was outreach done? Some outreach to organizations but mostly word of mouth was how providers learned about this opportunity. There was no match required to apply which may have contributed to the volume of applications (136 received, 92 eligible)

				 Completed projects discussed, what's going on with the rest? 5 projects are still actively working toward completion. 3 awards were rescinded because of non-response (may be related to the homes being leased rather than owned by the providers). Process for next funding round: Reviewing the two-year process—realized that so many legal and administrative steps were necessary. Will reach out to 66 eligible providers who were not funded the first time around (tent. Feb 2024).
				 Looking to award 5-8 projects at a time to be able to move faster. The goal is to wrap up projects within 12 months. Anticipated funding for round 2 is \$402,000.
				 Ensure that communication is clear on eligibility for round 2. Include other resources in communications about next steps, whenever possible. Explore surveying eligible providers in person (hybrid), as a group.
				 Follow ups: Zene' offered to help with small business outreach (contractors). Ashlyn wants to be involved with this project however if makes sense.

- Children and youth who identify as LGBTQ
- Otherwise vulnerable children and youth

DESIRED OUTCOMES:

Funded strategies will be evaluated based on reducing educational achievement gaps for the prioritized populations as measured by the following educational outcomes:

- Kindergarten readiness
- High school graduation rates
- Postsecondary program acceptance rates
- Postsecondary degree or certification completion
