

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






Developmental Disabilities and Early Childhood Supports Division Report February 2023





What's going on?

Universal Developmental Screening (UDS) Advisory Group, just wrapped up a series of sessions. The UDS Advisory Group learned about the work done over the past few years and provided feedback on priorities and focus for the upcoming funding opportunity.




In early March, the Universal Screening Strategy will release a new funding opportunity to fund:

- programs that offer diverse training opportunities for parents, caregivers, and people working in early childhood development
- programs that partner with families to destigmatize developmental promotion and screening efforts

What's going on?



Early Support for Infants and Toddlers (ESIT) served a record 5,985 children with delays or disabilities and their families in King County during 2022. This was a 12% increase over the number served in 2021 and a 53% increase over the number of children served in 2015!

The ESIT Provider Request for Applications (RFA) is open!

- This RFA is seeking responses from current ESIT provider agencies to access funding to support their efforts, progress, and plans to strengthen Racial Equity and disability justice, in alignment with Best Starts values.
- ESIT will be seeking community members to participate in the RFA review panel, in particular parents and caregivers whose child(ren) recently received ESIT services, and community members who represent the cultural, linguistic, ethnic, and geographic diversity of King County. We will share more information when the review panel dates are finalized.

What's going on?

The Seattle Developmental Bridge Program, serving children ages 0-4 to help them connect to their next early learning opportunity, served 195 families in 2022. Over 92% of families served reported that they were very satisfied or extremely satisfied with the services they received.

School-to-Work


Employment Transition Program

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

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2023 ANNUAL BOARD ELECTION PROCESS

The Chair will call for the election of Vice Chair, followed by the election of the Chair. The process outlined below will be used for the annual elections:

- The Chair will call for nominations for Vice-Chair.
- Board Members may nominate and vote for themselves.
- The nominee elected Vice-Chair, may not run for the Office of Chair.
- Nominees will be asked to share their goal(s) for the upcoming year.
- Presentations will not exceed three minutes.
- Once all nominees share their main goals, the Chair will call for a vote.
- The Chair will call on each Board Member individually for their vote.
- We ask Board Members to not abstain.
- The candidates receiving most votes begin their one-year terms in office beginning on April 1, 2023.
- If the vote is tied, we will vote again.

The Chair will then repeat the process for the position of Chair
