MARCH BOARD EVENT DISCUSSION: CAREGIVER SUPPORTS – LIFE AFTER HIGH SCHOOL Laura Musso Escude, Board Member provided a summary of the March Board sponsored event titled, Caregiver Supports – Life After High School. The event hosted a resource fair where families connected with providers to discuss eligibility and available services. The panel discussion provided helpful information and experiences to assist families in planning to meet the needs of their young adults as they approach and experience life after high school.
