20025 DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES AND DELAYS LEGISLATIVE FORUM AND PRIORITIES

Jenna Wolfstone, DDECSD presented the draft Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities and Delays 2025 Legislative Priorities and provided a schedule for the legislative forum. Below are the draft 2025 Legislative Priorities:

- Promote language access for all children and individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) by providing funding to service providers for spoken and sign language supports.
- Improve access to early support for infants and toddlers ages 0-3 by re-aligning funding policies to ensure that rates for special education funding for ages 0-3 are increased to match the rates for ages 3-5 and increase whenever rates increase for age 3-5.
- Strengthen services and treatment for youth with behavioral health and I/DD in crisis by sustaining and expanding behavioral health support teams and growing short-term residential treatment capacity for youth.
- Maintain access to high school transition investments for students with I/DD by continuing funding to support employment and other essential services.

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- Protect opportunities for employment and meaningful inclusion in the community through increasing provider payments to strengthen staffing that would help avoid delays or interruptions in services access.
- Increase and maintain access to affordable housing and wraparound services.
 invest in the Housing Trust Fund, including funds for repairs, and increase funding for operations and housing support services.
