International Day of Persons with Disabilities



Amplifying the Leadership of Persons with Disabilities for an Inclusive and Sustainable Future

International Day of Persons with Disabilities is observed on **December 3**. First celebrated in 1992, this day has marked over three decades of progress and advocacy for the rights and inclusion of persons with disabilities.

The day seeks to raise awareness of disability issues and mobilize support for the dignity, rights, and well-being of persons with disabilities. It also highlights the benefits and contributions of persons with disabilities in all aspects of political, social, economic, and cultural life, promoting a truly inclusive and sustainable society.

Universal Developmental Screening and Promotion



Universal Developmental Screening and Promotion (UDSP) provides information, training, tools, and connections with other providers to ensure that all children in King County receive culturally responsive, high-quality developmental screening throughout early childhood.

Developmental screening helps early childhood practitioners celebrate milestones, promote early

learning, and identify young children who may benefit from extra support in one or more areas of development. Families are supported in understanding their child's development and connecting with resources that nurture their child's growth and wellbeing. Identifying developmental delays early is key to linking children to Early Support for Infants and Toddlers (ESIT) services, which can have a big impact on a young child's success in school and life.

Screenings are offered in any context where a family and child interact with an early childhood practitioner, including healthcare, early learning, and community settings. Community-based partners implement the core components of this work, and customize education on early childhood milestones, developmental screening tools, and delivery of UDSP for Black/African American, Chinese, Pacific Islander, Somali, and Latinx communities.

UDSP Vision

All King County children and families receive highquality developmental screening throughout early childhood that centers each child's and family's **strengths** and seamlessly connects them to appropriate, accessible, and timely developmental support.
