

# School-to-Work

## Data Highlights

School-to-Work (S2W) is all about jobs, helping students with intellectual or developmental disabilities seek and obtain paid employment across King County. With a motto of "Jobs by June", it is a student/family and system-wide partnership that connects students with developmental disabilities to employment services early, while students are still in their high school transition programs.

### Since 2010...

Approx. **2,200** participants received S2W services from a provider in King County

**50%** of S2W participants obtained employment

Over **750** unique businesses employed S2W participants

### In 2025...

**60%** of S2W participants identify as Black, Indigenous, or People of Color

**90%** of S2W students that exited in 2024 have transitioned into Individual Employment and/or Community Inclusion services
