## Summary

**NOTE: Washington State Supreme Court orders related to the coronavirus pandemic, beginning March 2020, affect the statistics for the foreseeable future.**

- **Filings (Table 1)**

In July 2024, a total of 87 juvenile offense cases were filed. In 2024, the monthly average filings were the highest since the COVID-pandemic, with 79 cases per month filed each month. This compares with a monthly average of 102, 93, 66, 30, 42, and 60 cases in 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023 respectively.

- **Resolutions (Table 2-A)**

The number of resolutions in July 2024 was 70 cases. The year-to-date average monthly resolutions were also 58 cases. This compares with the average number of resolutions of 102, 86, 69, 52, 31, and 60 cases in 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023 respectively.

- **Age of Resolved Cases (Tables 2-C)**

Because of the relatively small number of resolutions each month, the average age is expected to fluctuate significantly from month to month. Therefore, a more robust measurement of the age is the “median age” (i.e., the days at which 50% of the cases were resolved below the “median age” and 50% beyond the “median age”). The median age of all resolved cases was 132 days in July 2024.

- **Pending Caseload (Tables 3-A and 3-B)**

The pending active caseload (those cases not on warrant, deferred disposition, stay or appeal status, and not yet resolved) at the end of July 2024 was 447 cases, the highest since the middle of 2021. The pending caseload of juvenile offenses has been increasing because the disposition pace has not kept up with the filing volume. The pending numbers were 464, 647, 572, 286, 301, and 302 cases at the year-end of 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023, respectively.

- **Age of Pending Cases (Table 3-C)**

At the end of July 2024, the median age of the pending cases was 102 days, namely 50% of the pending cases were less than 4 months old (102 days), with 63 cases older than 9 months. This compares to median age of 111, 142, 241, 241, 122, and 90 days at the year end of the last 6 years.

**CONCLUSION: In 2024, the average filing volume for juvenile offense cases was 79 cases per month. Since 2023, the juvenile offense filings have increased noticeably when compared to the 3 years between 2020 and 2022. The court disposed 58 cases per month on average in 2024, a lower volume than the filings. The difference between the disposition and filing has resulted in a continued rise in pending caseload. The pending active juvenile offense caseload was 447 cases at the end of July 2024, the highest in the last three years and with 63 cases over 9 months.**

## Terminology

### **Age of Pending Case**

Time (days) from filing to resolution, less suspense time if applicable.

### **Age of Resolved Case**

Time (days) from filing to resolution, less suspense time if applicable.

### **Filing**

A juvenile offense case filed at the King County Superior Court with a new case number assigned.

### **Median Age**

Half cases are less and half cases are more (the 50 percentile).

### **Pending Case**

A case is defined as pending if it is unresolved and not on suspense status.

### **Pending Caseload**

Number of pending cases at the end of reporting period.

### **Resolution**

A case is resolved if all issues in the complaint are fully adjudicated.

### **Resolution Category**

Four resolution categories are used to report resolution of criminal cases: Fact-findings (CVCT, AQCT), guilty plea (GP, GPAT), dismissal (DSM, DAT), and other (all other resolution codes).

### **Suspended Case**

A case is placed in suspense status (removing from active) during the reporting period.

### **Suspense Status**

A case is said to be on suspense status if it is on warrant or appeal.

### **Suspense Time**

Time (days) a case is on suspense status.

### **DDSP – Deferred Dispositions**

Entered – A case listed as entered means that a youth has stipulated to the facts in support of the charge and is considered adjudicated per RCW 13.4-0.127 however the court defers imposition of the disposition based on conditions being met.

Completed by Dismissal – The youth complied with all terms of the deferred disposition conditions and the case is dismissed and charges vacated.

Completed by Order of Disposition – The youth did NOT comply with all terms of the deferred disposition and is sentenced.

Figure 1. Number of Juvenile Offense Filings, Resolutions and Pending Caseload by Month

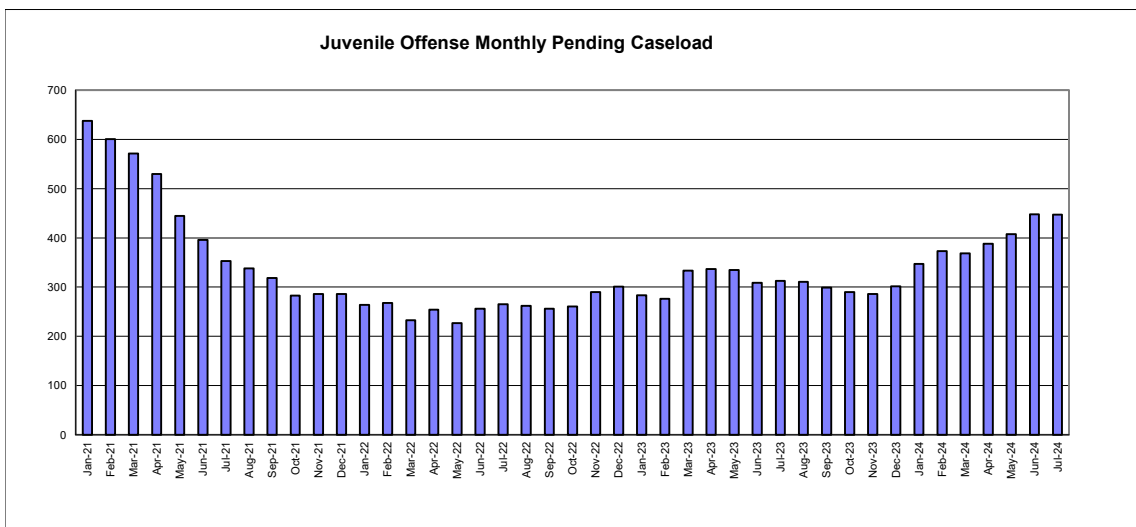
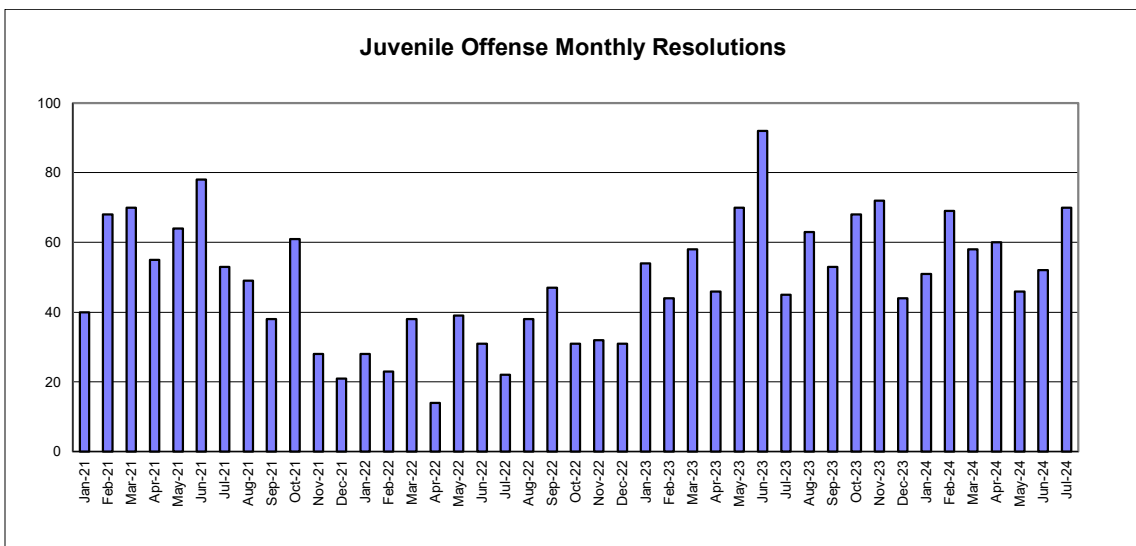
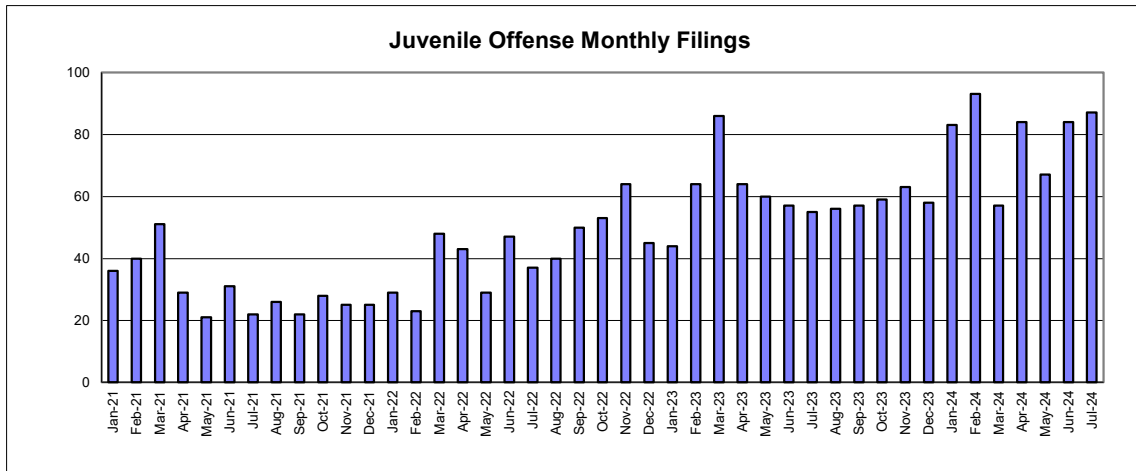
