
Highlights


- <u>Criminal Cases</u>. The criminal filings in the first quarter of 2024 were 1,285 cases, showing a 5% decrease from the same quarter in 2023. MRJC accounted for 37% of the criminal cases filed. The resolutions of criminal cases in 2024 matched the filing pace, totaling 1,291 cases. The pending criminal caseload at the end of March 2024 was 3,918 cases (excluding RALJ). Of the 3,918 pending criminal cases, 39% were the MRJC cases.
- <u>Civil Cases</u>. Filings in civil cases (case type 2) in the first quarter of 2024 were significantly higher than that in 2023, showing an increase of 36% from the same time in 2023. The increase in civil filings was primarily due to the increase in unlawful detainer cases and civil protection petitions. The civil resolutions were lower than the filing volume in the same period. The pending civil caseload was 8,394 cases at the end of March 2024, 1,632 cases higher than a year ago (+24%). The MRJC had 37% of the pending civil caseload at the end of the first quarter of 2024.
- **Domestic Cases.** Domestic case (case type 3) filings in the first quarter of 2024 were slightly lower than 2024, with 4% decrease. A total of 1,622 domestic cases were filed in the reporting quarter. The MRJC had 37% of the total filings in domestic cases. The resolutions of domestic cases fell behind the filing volume slightly in the same quarter. At the end of March 2024, the pending domestic caseload was 4,564 cases, with 39% being the MRJC cases.
- <u>ITA Cases</u>. The filings of ITA cases in 2024 remained at a high level. A total of 1,391 ITA cases were filed in the first 3 months of 2024, just slightly lower than the same period in 2023 (-4%). There were 362 ITA cases remaining to be adjudicated at the end of March 2024.
- Juvenile Dependency/Termination (DEP/TER) and At-risk Youth (ARY)/Child-in-Need of Service (CHINS) <u>Cases</u>. In the first quarter of 2024, dependency and termination filings were down 22% and 42% respectively from 2023. On the other hand, filings in ARY/CHINS/others and truancy were up 7% and 39% respectively from 2023. At the end of March 2024, the numbers of cases pending disposition in the non-Offense juvenile categories are: 242 dependency cases, 113 termination cases, 129 ARY/CHINS/Other cases, and 2,092 truancy cases.
- **Juvenile Offense Cases**. The juvenile offense filings in the first quarter of 2024 increased significantly from 2023, with 233 juvenile offense cases filed and 20% increase from the same time in 2023. The resolution pace for juvenile offense cases did not match the filing pace in the year. At the end of March 2024, there were 369 pending juvenile offense cases.
- **Pro Tem Use.** In the first quarter of 2024, the daily Pro Tem use by the court was 4.2 FTEs on average.
- **Post-resolution Modifications (Table 1-A).** In the first quarter of 2024, there were 111 post-resolution modifications filed (both parenting plan and relocation modifications) year-to-date.
- Active re-opened cases and family law modification cases (Table 4-A). At the end of March 2024, there were 903 active re-opened cases and 506 active family law modification cases.



In a jury case, it also includes the selection of the jury. A trial can be held for one or more cases. A single trial may be held to adjudicate more than one case (as defined above).
