#### **Problem: Complex fees in Code do** not fit today's broad industrial base

Heavy metals monthly charge =  $[Q_t - Q_s][Cost_{HM}]$ 12



#### **Process to create new fee system**

## **Proposed changes based on three years of consultations**



# Three decisions to change the fee system

- 1. King County streamlines the King County Code
  - Council adopted ordinance on 12/10/18
- 2. Department of Natural Resources (DNRP) proposes a public rule

We are here

- 45-day comment period required
- 1. Wastewater Treatment Division (WTD) implements new fee tier/structure and approves associated costs
  - Businesses can appeal tier placement


### Public rule process – Early 2019

- Public comment period 45 day minimum (January 7-February 28, 2019)
  - Newspaper ad
  - Email to expanded list
  - Web page
  - Public hearing
- Written response to comments
- Department Director signs proposed rule
- Effective 30 days later


#### **Process to assign fee tiers** (Spring 2019)

- WTD Director implements new category/tier structure and approves tier placement and fee amounts
- KCIW sends letter to facilities stating tier placement and fees
- Customers have 15 days to appeal tier
- KCIW sends billing information to local agencies
  - Earliest billing cycle: 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter 2019

### **Fees Affected by Proposal**



Issuance Fees for reviewing applications and issuing discharge authorizations



Compliance Monitoring and Administration Fees for inspections, sampling, lab costs, data review, permit management, technical assistance

### **Issuance Fee: Proposed Changes**



Simple permits pay less than more complex ones Lower fees for renewals and revisions

Minor Discharge Authorization	\$2,000	\$1,500	\$1,000
Letter of Authorization	\$1,500	\$1,125	\$750
Letter of Authorization–Construction	\$800	N/A	N/A

There is no issuance fee for:

- Zero Discharge Categorical
- No control document required
- Verbal authorization

#### **Compliance Monitoring and Administration Fee: Proposed Changes**



Set up fee tiers based on cost of service

Charge all facilities in the same tier the same annual fee



# New compliance monitoring and administration fees

#### Fees recover cost of service based on:

- $_{\circ}~$  Size and complexity of the facility
- Frequency of inspections
- Number and type of Sampling Events
- Laboratory analytical costs
- Permit administration

#### **Compliance Monitoring and Administration Fee tiers replace** *a portion* of the current surcharge



### **Benefits to customers**

- Fee Increases will be phased in over 4 years
- Certainty about fees for up to five years
- Clarity about reasons for fee
- Technical assistance to reduce or eliminate fees
