# Wastewater Treatment Division (WTD) Survey of Local Agency Rates

### Introduction

- WTD embarked on a project to collect rate information from its 34 local sewer agencies
- This work informed the Financial Capability Assessment (FCA) and household affordability report that WTD submitted to EPA as part of its CSO consent decree negotiations (still confidential)
- WTD obtained rate schedules for drinking water, local sewer collection, and stormwater for 34 differences agencies and calculating estimated average bills for the final ratepayer under different assumptions


## "Average" bills in WTD service area: Sum of sewer bills weighted by each agency's total customers

Understanding retail sewer and water bills allows WTD to calculate industry-standard affordability metrics such as the lowest quintile residential indicator and the hours worked at minimum wage

• Those metrics use benchmarks (e.g., 2%) that are based on either a full sewer bill to the customer or a "one water" bill that also includes drinking water

# Challenges and Definitions

- Researching, documenting, and calculating 34 different bills is a lot of work! Potential for data errors or misinterpretations
- Single water usage assumption (600cf) for consistency and simplicity: accurate in aggregate but doesn't represent "average" customer for each individual agency
- Estimates exclude system development charges (SDCs), such as WTD's capacity charge
- Local utility taxes are excluded from preliminary results—inclusion depends on whether we want to compare agencies cost of service or rate payers' burden
