


Wastewater Treatment Division

COAL CREEK SEWER UPGRADE

King County WTD serves our region

- WTD collects dirty water from 17 cities and 17 sewer districts
- We serve about 1.7 million people
- WTD operates 3 regional treatment plants and 2 local plants








Where your wastewater goes

- Dirty water goes down your drain and through your side sewer
- The City of Bellevue collects your wastewater
- King County collects wastewater from the City
- Wastewater is treated at South Plant in Renton








Coal Creek Trunk

- Built in the 1970's
- Pipe mostly follows Coal Creek
- Difficult to access for maintenance
- Located in a cherished natural area





Why do we need to do this project?

 The north Coal Creek Trunk needs more capacity

 This project lets locate much of the new pipe away from Coal Creek










Project Schedule

New pipe alignment

- Evaluated different options and construction methods
- Conducted field work: geotechnical studies, surveys
- Identified best method and alignment








Project elements

- Multiple pipe segments (shown on next slide) to provide capacity and maintain connections
- Restoration of affected areas
