Tree surveying for the Coal Creek Sewer Upgrade Project beginning May 7

King County's team is continuing field work to inform design of a new sewer pipe to serve the Bellevue and Newcastle areas. Crews have been carrying out field work as needed while the team refines the project design.

The County's project team is continuing inventory of trees within the project area. The effort will help establish both tree protection plans and a replacement plan for any trees that need to be removed during construction.

Beginning the week of May 7, surveyors will be present in the Natural Area and along the pipe alignment. Crews will tag trees and survey their location.


The new Coal Creek North Sewer pipe will provide needed capacity for a growing community and allow us to move most of the pipeline away from its existing location in Coal Creek. Construction of the new sewer line is scheduled to begin in 2022.

What to expect:

- Crews will install tree tags using aluminum nails. The tags and nails are non-toxic to trees.
- Some trees will be protected during construction. Trees that must be removed will be replaced according to City of Bellevue permits.
- Tags will remain attached to trees throughout the project.
