
# Did you see the latest project updates? We're here to discuss them with you.

The Coal Creek Project team knows that there is a lot going on in the world that may be taking your attention. We want to remind you to take a look at the design updates we shared earlier this year. We have updated information about construction locations, community impacts, and durations.

The project is currently in the permitting process. As part of the process, the City of Bellevue will be scheduling a public hearing that you can attend. We want to make sure you have the information and answers you need to participate if you are interested. We are available to answer your questions one-on-one or meet with your community group/organization.

These updates include some elements that neighbors and trail users may want to pay attention to, including:

- Proposed 24/7 work hours at the Red Cedar Trailhead area during tunneling to reduce duration of community impacts and construction risk
- New staging areas
- Completed trail detour around the construction area at the Red Cedar Trailhead
