We understand that you want to know how we will protect and restore the Coal Creek Natural Area during and after construction. Our most recent newsletter gives a snapshot of what to expect for environmental protections and restoration in different parts of the work area. You will also find a schedule update.

Want a sneak peak at the newsletter?

Here are some highlights of what we will do:

- Replant a native plant understory and evergreen trees at a more than 1:1 ratio
- Protect the stream and remaining trees during construction
- Create natural stream flows using log and rock features that create shade and shelter for fish
- Plant low-growing native plants at the parking lot entrance to improve sightlines and site security

This clean water project will provide increased capacity needed to carry wastewater from Newcastle and part of Bellevue to King County's South Treatment Plant in Renton. The Coal Creek Sewer Upgrade also provides the opportunity to move much of the



active pipe away from the creek in the popular Coal Creek Natural Area.
