



CONSTRUCTION BEGINS MONDAY AUGUST 23, 2010

Ravenna Park Ball field, adjacent trails closed to public through October

King County's contractor for the Ravenna Creek Transfer Pipe extension will begin work in Ravenna Park on at 7 a.m. on Monday, August 23, 2010. King County is extending the pipe as part of its regional wastewater conveyance and treatment responsibilities. Wastewater from residences and businesses collected by the City of Seattle is transported to the county's West Point Treatment Plant in Magnolia through pipes owned by the county. Extending the Ravenna Creek Transfer pipe protects public health and the environment by preventing sewer overflows into University Slough on the University of Washington campus.

Work hours for this project will typically be 7 a.m. – 5 p.m. on weekdays.

King County urges park users, pedestrians, bus riders, bicyclists and motorists to use extreme caution when passing by the construction site.

What to Expect

- Heavy machinery, construction materials and excavation equipment in the outfield of the Ravenna Park ball field (see map), entering from Northeast 55th Street
- Increased noise, dust and activity coming from the construction site
- No public access to the Ravenna Park ball field, the ball field stairs and some nearby trails
- Reduced access to the trails and creek bed near the construction site
- Reduced parking, increased congestion and pedestrian detours on N.E. 55th Street
