

E-Alert: Design Advisory Group Meeting #5

August 3, 2015

The King County Wastewater Treatment Division (WTD) Georgetown Wet Weather Treatment Station Design Advisory Group (advisory group) met at the South Seattle College Georgetown Campus on Thursday, July 30. Topics included sharing community feedback on the initial design concepts of the facility, presenting updated design concepts, and gathering advisory group comments on the conceptual design.

Michael Popiwny, King County WTD Project Manager, shared community feedback on the preliminary design concepts for the facility. The team gathered feedback through a variety of methods including online and in-person open houses, and community events. Community feedback was generally in line with advisory group feedback.

Mark Johnson, Signal Architecture + Research Project Architect, and Jonathan Morley, Berger Partnership Landscape Architect, presented updated design concepts for the facility, based on community and advisory group feedback. The advisory group shared their comments about how the concepts align with the community-based design guidelines.

Finally, Michael Popiwny and Kristine Cramer, King County WTD Community Relations, shared next steps for the advisory group and future community engagement for the project. The design team will be working to bring the project to 30% design by early 2016. The County will bring the advisory group back together to share updated designs at that time.
