

## E-Alert: Design Advisory Group Meeting #4

June 22, 2015

The King County Wastewater Treatment Division (WTD) Georgetown Wet Weather Treatment Station Design Advisory Group (advisory group) met at the South Seattle College Georgetown Campus on Thursday, June 18. Topics included finalizing the design guidelines, discussing early design concepts of the Wet Weather Treatment Station facility, gathering advisory group feedback about those concepts, and learning about King County's 1% for Art program.

Michael Popiwny, King County WTD Project Manager, shared the revised design guidelines. The design guidelines were developed based on discussions at the February advisory group meeting and revised based on feedback provided at the May meeting. The design team is using these guidelines to inform the design of the new facility.

Mark Johnson, Signal Architecture + Research Project Architect, and Rachel Mayer, Berger Partnership Landscape Architect, presented early design concepts for the facility. They discussed the site structures and opportunities for incorporating community ideas and concepts. The team then gathered the advisory group's design concept preferences through an interactive feedback exercise. **We want to hear from you! Cath Brunner, 4Culture, presented information about the 1% for Art Program, which creates opportunities for artists to have their work incorporated into public spaces. Cath shared examples of 1% for Art projects around King County. In addition, Tristan Surtees and Charles Blanc, Lead Artists for King County's Combined Sewer Overflow Program Art Master Plan, shared some examples of their work at other WTD facilities.
