

South Michigan Street Sidewalk and Lane Closure Week of February 6

Starting as early as Monday, February 6, King County Wastewater Treatment Division crews will close the north sidewalk and traffic lane on S. Michigan St. between East Marginal Way South and 4th Avenue South. The work is expected to last for three days. During the closures, crews will excavate up to 15 potholes in the sidewalk to locate utilities. This work is part of the County's project to build a new Wet Weather Treatment Station. The station will treat up to 70 million gallons per day of combined rain and sewage that would otherwise have discharged directly to the Duwamish without treatment during large storms.

What to expect:

- Sidewalk closures from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- Lane closure along S. Michigan St. between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m.
 - Two-way traffic will be maintained along S. Michigan St.
 - Signs to direct traffic around closed lanes and construction area
 - Expect some traffic delays when driving through the area
- Noise and vibration as crews use jackhammers and excavation trucks
- Metro bus stop #51870 serving routes 131 and 132 will remain open during work
