

Project update

Site preparation and demolition complete

King County's contractor, Titan Earthwork, has completed site preparation and demolition activities. Over the past few months crews:

- Demolished and removed aboveground structures
- Removed underground utilities, fuel storage tanks, and contaminated soil
- Installed a new security fence around the project site
- Graded the site to level the ground



Site preparation and demolition is complete

The site is now ready for construction of the Wet Weather Treatment Station, expected to begin in early 2018.

Throughout demolition, the project team used best management practices to protect public health and the environment. These included:

- Dust control measures, such as frequently spraying the site down with water
- Installing a silt fence to capture sediment in stormwater runoff to protect the Duwamish River
- Placing small rocks over the project site to control erosion and dust prior to construction

What to expect between now and early next year

- Minimal activity on the site
- Site monitoring by Titan Earthwork to ensure security
- Construction of a private development will continue on the property adjacent to the Georgetown Wet Weather Treatment Station site
- Update this fall on 2018 construction of the Wet Weather Treatment Station
- Active construction hotline during weekdays only, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. until construction activities begin
