

Project update

September 1, 2021

Nighttime construction planned to begin Friday, September 10th

Crews will complete roadway restoration and utility work on 4th Avenue South

Starting as early as Friday, September 10, 2021 crews will be working on 4th Avenue South near the Georgetown Wet Weather Treatment Station site from **7 p.m. to 5:30 a.m., Monday through Friday**. A noise variance permit and traffic control plan during this timeframe have been approved.

Nightwork will restore areas in the roadway impacted by construction and will support continued completion of the Georgetown Wet Weather Treatment Station project. Crews are constructing a new facility that will clean excess sewage and stormwater during heavy rains. This project will reduce untreated wastewater entering the Duwamish River by about 95 percent.

If you live or work near the treatment station site, you may have recently received a newsletter from us which shares an update on our progress and highlights how the community helped create the treatment station. Check out our [summer 2021 newsletter](#).

What to expect:

- Work hours between 7 p.m. and 5:30 a.m., Monday through Friday
- Work is expected to take approximately two working days to complete.
- North and southbound traffic will be reduced to one lane in each direction.
 - During work on the west side of 4th Avenue S, the northbound King County Metro Bus Stop will be temporarily relocated (see map above).
- People walking will be redirected depending on the location of active construction.
 - Please pay attention to signage and flaggers for your safety and the safety of our crews.
- Noise and lighting will be typical of a construction site.
- Security and staff on site.

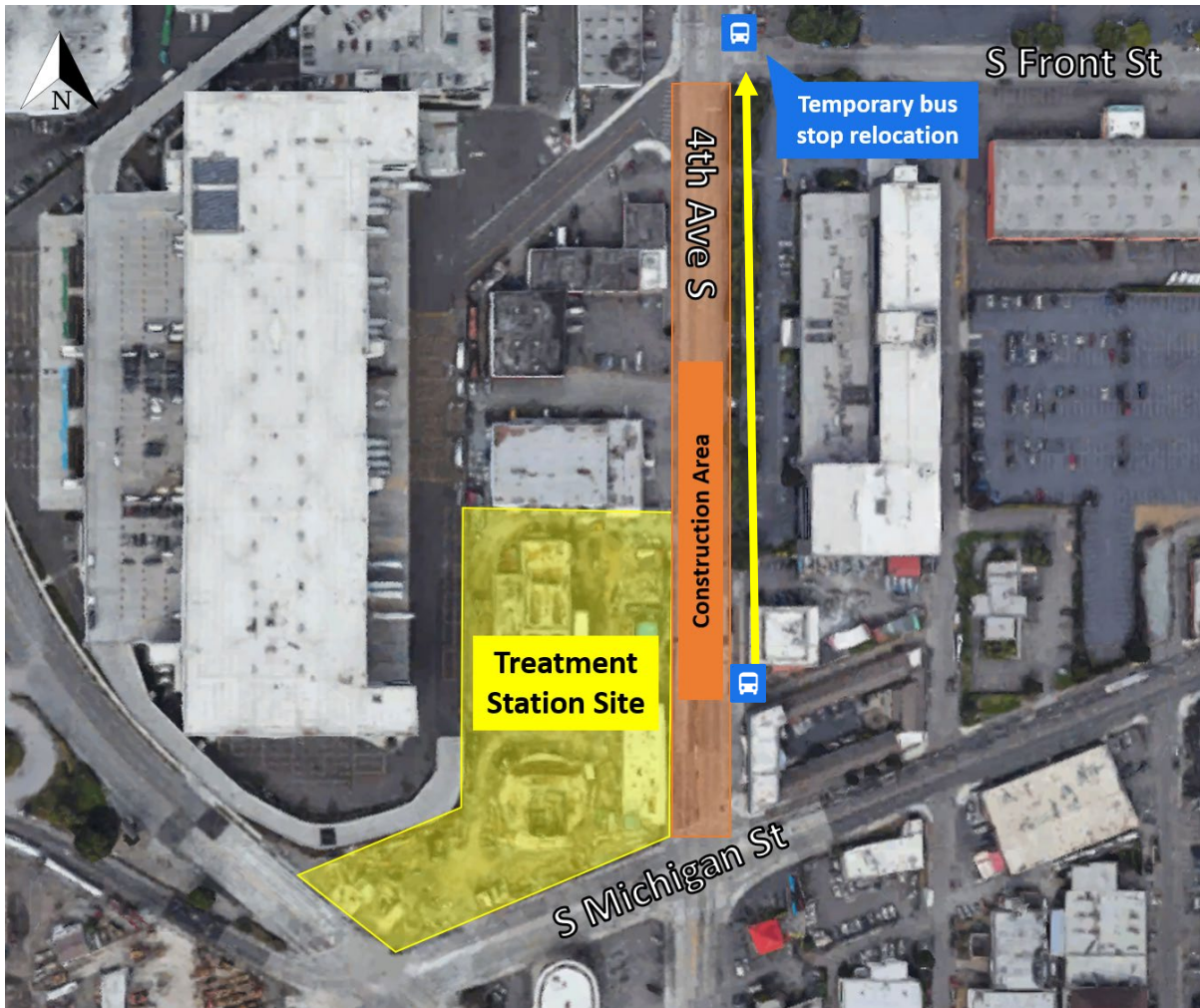
