Construction update: Sewer work to take place soon under Magnolia Bridge

No impact to using the bridge or its on and off ramps

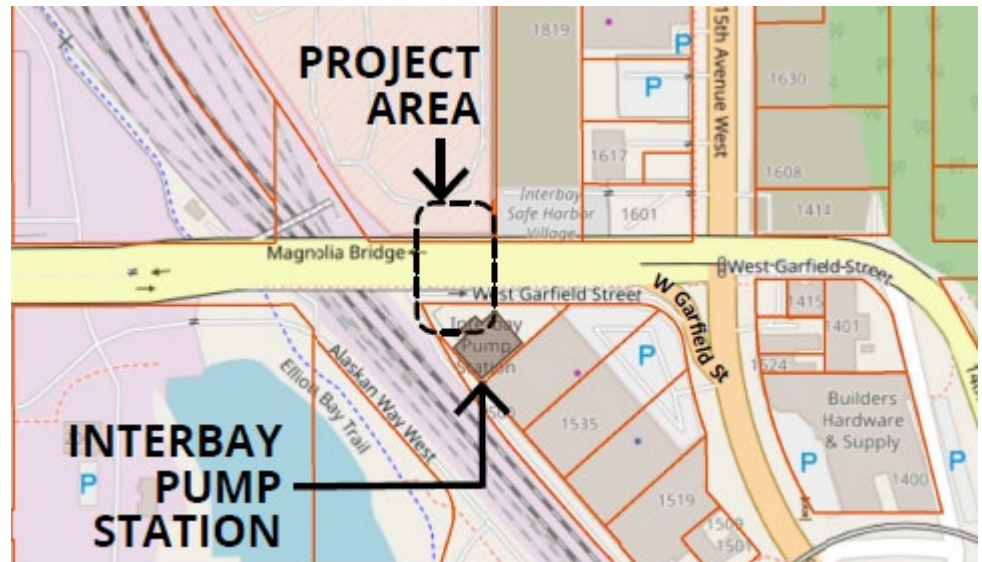
June 23, 2020

King County Wastewater Treatment Division will reinforce a section of sewer pipe from West Garfield Street (adjacent to the Interbay Pump Station) to just north of the Magnolia Bridge. Work will occur on a low-traffic portion of West Garfield Street that is under the Magnolia Bridge, just west of 15th Avenue West (see map).

Completion of this work is critical in assuring the reliability of our wastewater system.

Crews will dig down to the existing pipes and place additional concrete around several pipe joints that have been identified as potential weak spots.

The work will take approximately three months to complete.



What to expect during construction:

Noise:

- Large trucks and equipment moving in and out of the project area.
- A fence with noise reducing features will be installed on the east side of the construction site, but noise may be noticeable to passersby.

Construction duration: Scheduled to start as soon as June 29 and will take approximately three months to complete.

Work hours: Weekdays, *8 a.m. to 5 p.m., with possible Saturday work.

*-Any changes to scheduled work hours will be detailed in additional notices.

Traffic impacts:

- Temporary partial closure of West Garfield Street from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on workdays.
- No impacts to traffic on the Magnolia Bridge or on and off ramps.

Access to businesses will be maintained. All driveways will remain open.
