## DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE

TITLE OF PROPOSAL: Interbay Conveyance Rehabilitation and Odor Control

**DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSAL:** The King County Wastewater Treatment Division proposes to rehabilitate and upgrade approximately one mile of its sewer pipeline system located in the Interbay neighborhood of Seattle, Washington. The proposed project includes the following actions: Replacement of the 36-inch force main sewer pipes from the County's Interbay Pump Station to a point just north of the Magnolia Bridge with new 42-inch pipes; rehabilitation of the remainder of both force mains (48-inch diameter), extending north to the southwest corner of the Interbay Athletic Complex (IAC) Golf Center; construction of a new odor control facility on County property at the southwest corner of the IAC Golf Center; and rehabilitation of the a segment of the County's Elliott Bay Interceptor gravity sewer pipe extending north to the southwest corner of the IAC athletic fields. The project will be in construction for approximately three years starting in 2022.

LOCATION OF PROPOSAL, INCLUDING STREET ADDRESS, IF ANY: The project area is a linear corridor between the Magnolia Bridge to the south and W Dravus Street to the north, and between 15th Avenue W to the east and the BNSF Railway's Balmer Yard to the west. The address of the Interbay Pump Station is 1601 W Garfield Street, Seattle, WA. The new odor control facility site is west of the end of the unimproved W Wheeler Street, and northwest of the cul-de-sac at the end of W Armory Way.
