#### **King County Wastewater Treatment Division**

- More than 1.8 million people
- 394 miles of pipe
- 179 million gallons sewage treated/day

Works to protect our region's environment, health, and waterways by collecting and treating wastewater



### Lake Hills sewer relining

**Project objective:** Reline a 7,200-foot section of pipe in Bellevue to provide service for 50+ years.




### Lake Hills sewer relining

- Relining to reduce impacts
- Using spiral wound technology
- Service will be maintained via a temporary pipe




Figure 1: Large-Diameter SPR<sup>m</sup>TF Winding Machine

# **Project schedule**



- Construction expected to begin in spring 2023
- Work will occur for up to 6 months

# **Property owner coordination**

- Current design status: Final design
- Now evaluating need for temporary construction easements
- Introductory letters from property team expected Q2 2022

# What to expect during construction

- Typical work hours
  - Weekday daytime/evening hours
  - Saturday/Sunday daytime/evening hours
  - Occasional overnight work
- Traffic detours
- Limited sidewalk or driveway access
- Odors
- Noise from pumps



#### Traffic

- Traffic impacts on
  - Spring Blvd, 132nd Ave NE
  - 124th Ave NE, 120th Ave NE
  - Bel-Red Rd
- You can expect:
  - Lane closures and detours
  - Reduced speed limits
  - Increased congestion, delays
  - Bus stop closures and reroutes



# **Construction goals**

- Complete work on the pipe quickly to ensure it is safe and properly functioning
- Limit disruption to businesses and preschools in area
- Avoid blocking streets, driveways, or sidewalks with our equipment and vehicles
- Minimize traffic disruptions, environmental impact, and odor



# **Restoration of project area**

- Impacted work areas will be restored:
  - Roads will be repaved
  - Sidewalks will be replaced
  - Trees and shrubs will be replanted in work areas


