

# Notice 2: Construction Updates on Northeast Spring Boulevard Starting June 5

King County contractors will be working in the following areas in the Bel Red neighborhood of Bellevue starting the week of June 5.

# Here's what you'll notice along Northeast Spring Boulevard:

- At 130<sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast, from June 5 to October 1, unless otherwise noted:
  - Cutting and digging of the roadway to bury the temporary pipe underneath 130<sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast, from June 5-15.
  - Eastbound lanes on Spring will be closed intermittently for approximately three months. Vehicles will be detoured to Northeast 20th Street. Additionally, traffic will be reduced to a single lane on Spring in both directions from 130<sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast to 136<sup>th</sup> Place Northeast.
  - Bike lane on Spring closed, bicyclists detoured to share the road from 130<sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast to 136<sup>th</sup> Place Northeast.
  - Pedestrians will be detoured with construction signs at the light rail station sidewalk.
- At 132<sup>nd</sup> Avenue Northeast:
  - Cutting and digging of the roadway to bury the temporary pipe underneath 132<sup>nd</sup> from June 5-15. Traffic reduced to single lane in both directions intermittently throughout project duration.
- At 134<sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast:
  - Temporary pipe installed above ground across 134<sup>th</sup> from June 6-7.
  - Intersection of 134<sup>th</sup> and Spring closed, local access only with construction flaggers for approximately three months.
- Between 136<sup>th</sup> Place Northeast and Bel-Red Road:
  - Driveway access to Spring will be temporarily blocked for some properties during the cutting and digging of the roadway to bury the temporary pipe underneath sections of Spring on June 8. Impacted properties have previously been contacted by King County.
  - Driveway access to Spring will be blocked for some properties where the temporary pipe will be installed above ground on Spring from June 8 to October 1. Impacted properties have been previously contacted by King County.

#### Continued work:

- 120<sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast:
  - Closure of a section of the multi-use trail near Sound Transit. Pedestrians will be detoured to a temporary path and bicycles will be detoured to share 120th for approximately three months. Temporary pipe installed May 24-26.
  - Mobilizing equipment for a system of temporary pumps, pipes, and odor control that will maintain sewer service during construction.
- 124<sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast:
  - Traffic control continues on 124<sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast.

## What to expect:

- Typical work hours are 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. weekdays with occasional night and weekend work, however after June 8, contractors will be present onsite 24-hours a day for monitoring and refueling activities.
- There will be noise and odor from the temporary pumping system and other construction activities.
- Sewer service will be maintained.
