Notice 4.1: Closure of East bound NE Spring Blvd extended to October 1, 2023

King County crews are continuing to work in the Bellevue's Bel Red neighborhood.

Sewer construction will impact businesses and neighbors along Northeast Spring Boulevard through October 1, 2023

The following two bus stops on Route 226 **will not** be impacted as originally planned and communicated. They will **remain open** to the public.

- **136th Avenue Northeast and Bel-Red Road: Temporary bus stop relocation** to east of 136th Court Northeast, next to Public Storage.
- **132nd Avenue Northeast and Bel-Red Road: Temporary bus stop closure.** Riders can use the temporary bus stop east of 136th Court Northeast or the regular bus stop west of 130th Avenue Northeast and Bel-Red Road

Here is what you will notice:

- **Extension of eastbound closure** of Northeast Spring Boulevard, between 130th Avenue Northeast and 136th Place Northeast. No vehicle or bicycle access on the eastbound side through October 1, 2023.
- **Intersection closed** at 134th Avenue Northeast and Northeast Spring Boulevard.
- **Detour signs** posted to direct traffic around construction.
- Westbound Northeast Spring Boulevard will remain open to westbound vehicles and to pedestrians.
- **Cyclists dismount required** along the pedestrian pathway next to 120th Avenue Northeast. Cyclists must dismount as they pass through the pedestrian detour safely. See the image below for more one of the signs posted on the pathway.

What to expect:

- Typical work hours are 7 AM to 7 PM weekdays with occasional night and weekend work.
- There will be noise and odor from the temporary pumping system and other construction activities.
- Sewer service will be maintained.

The [interactive construction map](#) shows active construction updates on the streets between 120th Avenue NE and NE Spring Boulevard where temporary pipes, road and sidewalk closures, equipment staging and other construction activities will occur for up to seven months.

We will continue to keep the community, nearby businesses, and impacted properties informed as construction progresses.
