On the morning of Wednesday, April 29, King County Wastewater Treatment Division (WTD) staff will be walking in your neighborhood to gather updated information about the County's Lake Hills sewer pipeline. King County WTD is in the beginning stages of a project to upgrade the Lake Hills Trunk, which has provided wastewater service to the area for 60 years. This field visit will help the project team get an on-the-ground picture of the area as it is today.

About the Lake Hills Sewer Upgrade Project

To maintain reliable sewer service to your area, King County needs to upgrade the Lake Hills Trunk. This project is still in early planning stages focused on information gathering.
