

## Work crews near Sammamish River Trail this summer

To maintain reliable sewer service to the Downtown and Idylwood neighborhoods, King County Wastewater Treatment Division will replace aging sewer pipelines in Redmond. Construction won't begin until 2018, but we need to collect some preliminary information near the Sammamish River Trail this summer.

## **Summer 2016 field investigations**

Crews will work alongside the trail periodically from June to September to collect information such as soil and groundwater conditions and utility locations. Crew work hours will likely be from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Crews will use a drill rig to collect soil samples beside the trail. During this time, safety signage and flaggers will be placed on both sides of the equipment to warn trail users. The work area will be protected with cones, signage, and caution tape.

## What to expect

- Crews and equipment near the trail periodically
- Trail will be open, but may be narrowed at some times
- Work hours likely from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Dates and times of work posted to our website and sent via text alert in advance
