Lake Hills and NW Lake Sammamish Sewer Upgrade Project

Fieldwork efforts nearing completion – alignment for new sewer pipe to be finalized in early 2017

King County is upgrading a four-mile long sewer line that serves Redmond homes, businesses and schools. The Lake Hills and NW Lake Sammamish sewer line runs from the Idylwood Neighborhood to Redmond City Hall. The sewer line needs to be replaced to continue safe and reliable service into the future.

King County’s project team began fieldwork this summer to better understand and soils under the existing pipe. Additional work to identify and assess existing utilities along the pipeline will occur in early 2017.

The project team is also studying the project’s potential trail and traffic impacts, working closely with the City of Redmond and King County Parks.

The team will use all of this information to finalize the new pipe’s alignment. Early next year, we will be out in your community to share information, gather your thoughts, and hear your input.
