# Sammamish River in-water survey work north of the Leary Way Bridge week of July 5

Crews working for King County's Lake Hills and NW Lake Sammamish Sewer Upgrade Project will survey the Sammamish River north of the Leary Way NE Bridge starting Tuesday, July 5. Two crew members will perform the survey from a pontoon boat. In areas too shallow for the boat, crews will work from the shore using traditional hand-carried survey equipment.

Crews will access the river from the Sammamish River Trail near the bridge at Leary Way. The photo below shows the approximate area of the bathymetric survey, the boat access point, and the expected equipment.

## What you can expect

- Work will last approximately three days, starting as early as July 5
- Work hours 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. each day, week days only
- Two crew members will work from a pontoon boat and from shore
- Crews will access the Sammamish River from the Sammamish River Trail on the south side of the River, just north of the Leary Way NE Bridge (*see map on next page*)


Starting the week of July 10, we'll survey several creeks in the project area. We also plan to conduct additional field work this summer, including ground survey, soil sampling, and groundwater tests. We'll send messages to the listserv, distribute fliers to near neighbors, and post updates to the project website at kingcounty.gov/KCRedmondSewer in advance of any field work.

### About the project


King County needs to upgrade about 4.5 miles of the sewer line to meet the needs of the growing Redmond and Bellevue communities as the existing sewer line nears the end of its service life. Construction for the pipeline is scheduled to begin in 2020.
