

Lake Hills and NW Lake Sammamish Sewer Upgrade Project

ABOUT ► THE PROJECT

King County will upgrade a 4.5-mile-long sewer pipe in Redmond. The sewer pipe is aging and needs more capacity to meet the needs of this growing community. Construction is expected to begin as early as 2022 and take about three years. The new pipe will provide sewer service for another 50 years or more.

King County staff often use robots to inspect our regional sewer pipes. Their work is essential to protecting public health and keeping our waters clean.



Construction for the Lake Hills/NW Lake Sammamish Sewer Upgrade Project is no longer expected to begin in 2021.

To complete the sewer upgrade, King County must get permits from the City of Redmond, City of Bellevue, and several state and federal agencies. It is important to take the time to get all necessary permits to install the new pipe in the safest way possible, limit impacts, and maximize improvements for people and the environment. While the project's design continues, we are experiencing slowdowns in acquiring all the permits that are necessary to complete this work.

Construction will not begin until 2022 at the earliest. We expect to have a better estimate of when we will start construction by spring 2021. Thank you for your continued patience.

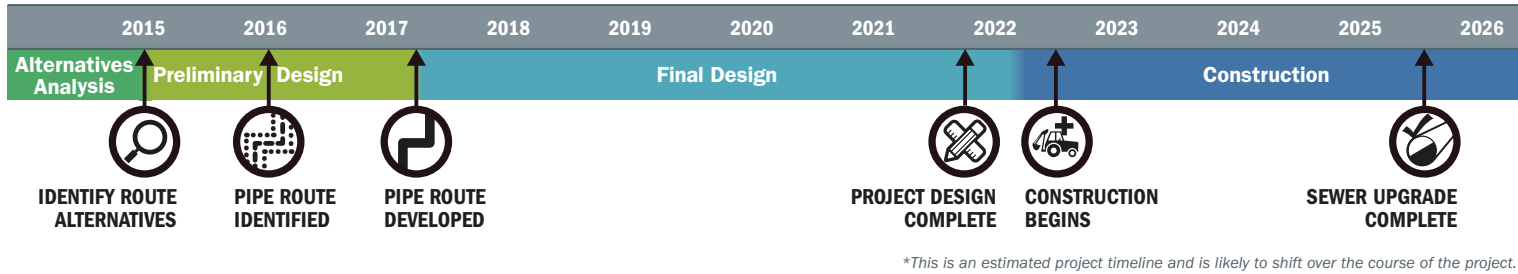
