Soil tests in Your Neighborhood beginning Monday, June 20

Starting as early as Monday, June 20, the King County Wastewater Treatment Division (WTD) will be conducting soil testing in your neighborhood to evaluate soil and groundwater conditions. The work will take place on a section of property recently purchased by King County to help inform the design of a future WTD facility.

Crews will begin drilling as early as Monday, June 20 and expect the work to take approximately two weeks to complete.

A truck mounted drill rig will bore 2 holes ranging from 20 to 30 feet below the surface. The bore holes will be filled with bentonite. Each bore hole is expected to take up to two days. An excavator will also dig a total of 6 test pits and 4 infiltration pits ranging from 4 to 10 feet below the surface. The work will take approximately 4 days. King County will notify the community if the work is expected to take longer than the planned dates.

What to Expect

- Work hours between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.
 Monday through Friday.
- Noise close to the work area, including the sound of a motor during drilling and excavating.
- Work and equipment will be confined to the project site.
- There are no anticipated roadway impacts for this work.
