Soil surveying work starts November 18, 2024

A small team working for King County Wastewater Treatment Division will begin surveying along and near the M Street Trunk sewer pipes. Survey activities include shovel probing the soil and placing flags at areas of interest.

This is expected to last one day and will help inform the design of the M Street Trunk Rehabilitation Project.

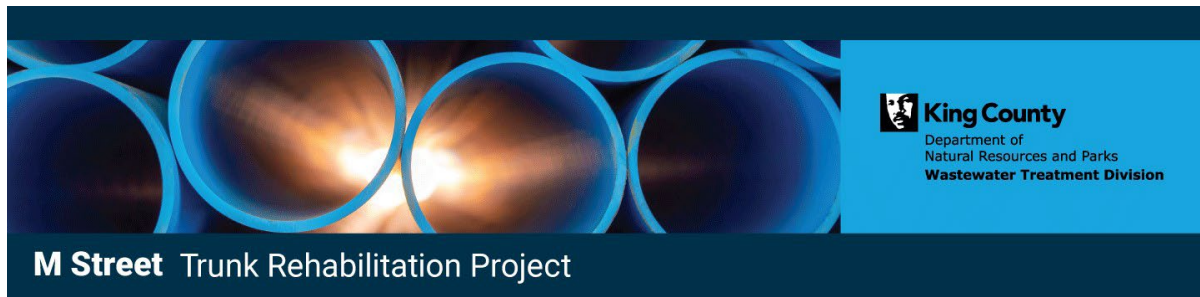
The completion of the survey work may change depending on weather.

What you can expect:

- Work will be performed outside private property.
- Work hours 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. on business days.
- All roads including Main Street will remain open to traffic.



About the project

The M Street Trunk collects and carries untreated wastewater from homes, businesses, and schools in your neighborhood and sends it to the South Treatment Plant in Renton, where it is cleaned and released into Puget Sound.

The M Street Trunk Rehabilitation Project will repair about 2.6 miles of deteriorated sewer pipes with more than 100 side sewer connections to homes and businesses. The project will also rehabilitate 45 precast maintenance holes.

The rehabilitation work will keep the M Street Trunk working for you and your neighborhood for decades, avoiding failure, overflow, and service disruption. During this work, all the wastewater carried through the M Street Trunk must be sent into a temporary system of pumps and diversion pipes above and below ground to maintain sewer service to the community.

The M Street pipe serves a densely populated area with many schools, homes, and businesses in the City of Auburn. During construction for the project, there will be impacts to traffic, including detours, temporary lane closures, and bus stops. We will work with the community to limit these disruptions and share information about any impacts before they occur.
