In-stream work beginning July 17

Expect construction activities near North Mercer Pump Station for the next month

Upcoming work near the North Mercer Pump Station:

Beginning as early as July 17*, crews will begin installing pipes underneath the stream on the east side of the North Mercer Pump Station. To install the pipe, crews will temporarily divert the flow of water around the construction area where the pipes will be located. While working in the stream, crews will also be making improvements to the trash rack at the pipe culvert on the south side of S.E. 22nd Street.



The stream will be restored to regular flows after work is complete.

Crews will install environmental protection measures for the duration of the work to monitor water quality and protect wildlife. On-site biologists will remove and relocate resident fish in compliance with approved permits. While the stream is diverted, near neighbors may notice occasional, momentary changes in the flow of water while protective measures are installed. Crews will restore the stream bed and return stream flows to their natural state after work is complete. The pipe will not cross S.E. 22nd St.

PSE Road Closures:

Additionally, as early as July 18, Puget Sound Energy will close one lane on the south side of S.E. 22nd Street during normal work hours. The lane closure will make space for other construction work at the entrance to the North Mercer Pump Station. The lane closure will approximately last for the rest of the week.

*Construction schedules can change based on factors such as site conditions, weather, and crew/material availability. We will notify you in advance of any major changes to the planned schedule.

What to expect:

- All work will be performed at the stream near North Mercer Pump Station.
- Water quality will be continuously monitored during this work.
- Momentary change of in-stream water flow.
- Typical work hours are 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday to Friday and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturday.
- Noise, dust, and vibrations typical of an active construction project.
 - Continuous noise while heavy construction equipment is operating on site.
- There will be construction equipment and trucks hauling materials on roads near the Pump Station.
