# Construction equipment and activity coming to Enatai Beach Park as early as July 1

Work will continue intermittently in the park for up to four years

Construction materials and equipment will arrive soon at Enatai Beach Park in preparation for Enatai Siphon construction. Enatai Beach Park will be used to stage non-flammable construction materials before crews begin active construction. Crews will stage materials behind a temporary fence underneath the I-90 bridge. ### New construction staging area and work zone:

Crews will be working and staging materials in the park over the next four years. The first step of this process is to stage construction materials, in the area highlighted in purple.

## What to expect during construction:

- Noise and dust typical of an active construction site.
- Increased construction equipment and trucks hauling materials on roads near the park.
- Construction equipment such as excavators, large trucks, backhoe, soil compactors, etc.
- Intermittent closures in portions of the park.




### How we will restore the park:

Disturbed areas will be restored to equal or better conditions, including:

- New access road compatible with a future phase of park development.
- New electrical cabinets and pipes to release clean air under the I-90 bridge.
- Improving shoreline north of the swim area by installing large logs.
- Providing habitat for spawning salmon and other wildlife.
