

## Geotechnical work to begin in Bellevue Week of July 11, 2016

King County Wastewater Treatment Division is in full swing with field investigations to inform design of a sewer upgrade project in Mercer Island and Bellevue. Surveyors have been working along the project area in Mercer Island and Bellevue, and surveying the lake bottom near the northeast shoreline of Mercer Island and across the East Channel of Lake Washington. Beginning as early as July 12, crews will conduct a number of geotechnical borings in Bellevue. These investigations will help the project team evaluate soil and groundwater conditions along the new pipeline alignment.

Next week, crews will drill in the right-ofway on the corner of SE $34^{\text {th }}$ Street and $109^{\text {th }}$ Avenue SE.

What you can expect


Typical drill rig for work in streets

- Crews will mark boring locations as early as July 7. This work will not disrupt traffic.
- Flaggers will direct vehicle and pedestrian traffic around the work site, as necessary.
- Work hours typically 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday to Friday.
- Work is expected to last about three to four days per location, depending on field conditions.
- A drill rig will be located in the right of way until the boring is complete.
- There will be equipment notice close to the work area.
- When work is complete, the site will be restored according to City of Bellevue standards.

Please watch for equipment and signs in the area, travel slowly to stay safe, and follow direction from flaggers.
