In-water survey work near Enatai Beach Park and Mercer Island Boat Launch starting June 21

During the summer of 2017, King County Wastewater Treatment Division will conduct field investigations to inform design of a sewer upgrade project in Mercer Island and Bellevue. As early as Wednesday, June 21, crews will begin in-water survey work near Enatai Beach Park and the Mercer Island Boat Launch.

These surveys will help our team understand the condition of the project area and features near the shoreline as we continue design for the North Mercer Island and Enatai Sewer Upgrade Project.

- As early as June 21, crews will begin in-water survey near Enatai Beach Park
- As early as June 27, crews will begin in-water survey work near the Mercer Island Boat Launch.

What you can expect

- Crews working in float tubes and kayaks in the water, and crews with tripods on shore
- Crews will work near Enatai Beach
 Park the week of June 21 for about four days and near the Mercer Island Boat Launch for about two days
- Enatai Beach water access and the Mercer Island Boat Launch will remain open during this work
- Work hours typically 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday to Friday



Crews will use tripods from shore to take survey readings.

Please watch for equipment and crews in the area, maintain slow boat speeds to stay safe, and follow direction from crews.
