



NORTH MERCER ISLAND/ENATAI Sewer Upgrade Project

April 19, 2019

Tree survey near I-90 Trail and North Mercer Pump Station starting as early as April 23

King County Wastewater Treatment Division is continuing field investigations to inform design of a sewer upgrade project in Mercer Island and Bellevue. Beginning as early as April 23, a team of surveyors and a city arborist will be walking along the project alignment to record tree data. This data will support an Arborist Report detailing tree impacts during construction. Construction is expected to begin in 2020. See map below for approximate survey location.

What to expect:

- Work hours 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., weekdays.
- Work is expected to take up to 5 days.
- Two crew members wearing bright safety gear.
- Crews using survey equipment to measure and photograph trees.
- Trail and road access will be maintained.
- A work truck will be parked on road shoulders. Safety cones will be used around work vehicle.

Tree removal and replanting

- King County will share more information about tree removal and replacement once the Arborist Report is finalized.
- Trees will be replaced using the City of Mercer Island and Washington State Department of Transportation code requirements.



Crews will use survey equipment to measure and photograph trees along the I-90 Trail and around North Mercer Pump Station.
