



NORTH MERCER ISLAND/ENATAI Sewer Upgrade Project

CONSTRUCTION AHEAD:

Major construction set to begin later this year across north Mercer Island and southwest Bellevue

King County is upgrading four miles of sewer pipeline across north Mercer Island and southwest Bellevue. In addition to the new sewer pipeline, King County will upgrade the County’s North Mercer Pump Station, as well as the City of Mercer Island’s Lift Station 11 at Fruitland Landing. The pipes, installed in the 1970s, are aging and reaching capacity.

The sewer upgrade is a big project that’s been years in the making and will involve years of construction. We expect construction to begin this fall and be complete in 2025. Some of the work will be in heavily used public spaces, and some will be in residential areas. The end product will provide great public benefit, but the work to get there will involve inconveniences to residents and park and trail users. We are committed to keeping you informed about what’s happening and why in order to minimize impacts wherever possible.

If you live near the future pipeline, you have heard from us over the past years. If you live on the south side of Mercer Island, you are receiving this because you will see construction as you head off the island.

Getting from there to here

Design on the project began in 2016 and will wrap up this spring. During the design phase, the project team created a plan for the new sewer pipe that included its location, size, technical needs, associated equipment, and construction details. At the same time, the project team made plans to upgrade the North Mercer Pump Station and Mercer Island's Lift Station 11 to accommodate the new sewer line. The team completed an environmental review under the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA), acquired the necessary permits to do the work, and developed contract specifications for construction.

While the engineers were designing the pipes and equipment, we were talking with nearby neighbors. Thank you to everyone who helped us understand your neighborhood and its values.



CONSTRUCTION COMING SOON

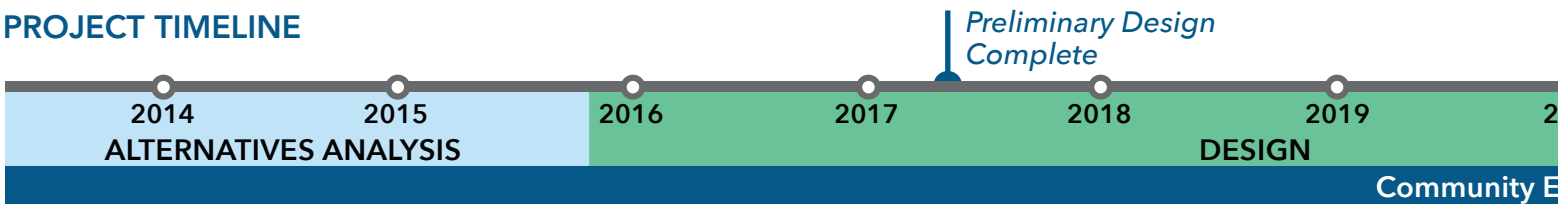


This spring and summer, we will prepare for major construction activities, expected to begin this fall. That means we will finalize our contract documents and job specifications, hire contractors to do the work, and get all the paperwork in place to get started.

As we near construction, here are some things to keep in mind:

- ▲ Construction overall will take four years, but most locations will see much shorter work durations. There will be times when construction is occurring in several locations simultaneously.
- ▲ King County is committed to being a good neighbor during construction. We provide advance notification of construction activities as well as a 24-hour construction hotline.
- ▲ This is a big project and most people won't be impacted by all of it. That's why we're planning targeted communications for different locations and different concerns.

The I-90 Trail will be restored or resurfaced, consistent with Washington State Department of Transportation standards, and in alignment with Mercer Island's Aubrey Davis Park Master Plan.



The North Mercer Pump Station will have new landscaping.



We will plant trees to replace the ones we remove and restore shorelines.
