
# Let's plan a project for our new house!

- 1916 Barn house style with addition
- Large lot, ¾ acre
- Lawn, mature hemlock tree, some shrubs around house













#### Take a good look at your neighbors

- > Do they have attractive landscape elements?
- > Is there something you want to block out?
- > Do they have a view?
- > Will my plan affect their home, property, or utilities?
- > Do I know where the property line is?







#### Know the rules


> Local jurisdiction



> Critical areas- slopes, creeks, wetlands,

protected waters











## Mind your utilities

- Locate overhead and underground utilities
- Choose plants that don't cause utility problems
- Locate hardscape thoughtfully







#### When You Don't Mind Utilities!


- Roots find water and take the easiest path to it.
- Call 811 locate prior to projects and then take photos of where painted lines are.

#### Hardscape and Roots




- Locate hardscape thoughtfully.
- Consider plant material adjacent to hardscape areas.
- Root barrier products are available.



#### **Avoid Future Issues!**

- Pay attention to what is above.
- There may be regulations about what you can plant.
- Is your property on a corner? Consider sight triangles.







#### Plant With Growth in Mind

- Space plant material for full growth.
- Smaller plants are cheaper but avoid tighter spacing.
- Example: Monkey Puzzle trees....do they stay small?


Landscaping around utilities or in the right-of-way will be removed at some point.














- Map out what you've got:
  - Paths
  - Views
  - Utilities
  - Existing vegetation
  - Site constraints such as slopes, septic fields, and wet areas



### Give yourself a path forward


- Map out how you want to use your yard
  - Travel areas
  - Pet use areas
  - Play areas
  - Sitting areas
  - Perimeter screen


















### Safety and access first



(Right) Lower growing plants free up walking space and allow a view to the front door.

(Left) Before- big shrubs along the walkway to the door reduce visibility and walkability





#### Other Issues with Large Shrubs



- Critters can find access
- Reduces air flow at foundation and siding
- Branches can grow where they shouldn't






If Something Isn't Right, Correct It


 If you have inhereted problem plants, consider correcting past mistakes.

 Removal cost increases as plants and trees grow.






#### We've moved our shrubs



#### Consider the Future



- How permanent do you want those hardscape elements?
- Are there anticipated improvements or changes?





## Layer the landscape

- Plants at low, medium, and high level (plant height or pots)
- Plant taller plants farther away in a view to give impression of space
- Plant to accent your hardscape









#### **Expanding sense of space**



Curving lines and peninsulas make a space appear larger and give more planting area

### Decide how you'll prepare the space


Build beds or boxes, buy pots, acquire salvage pieces

Remove or move existing vegetation

Plan and prepare for rain gardens and ponds









#### Are You Considering Retaining Walls?

- Concrete walls need solid footings.
- Block walls may need geogrid fabric.
- Anything over 4' needs to be engineered.
- Terraced retaining walls have regulations as well.









#### Wood Retaining Walls?

- Timber walls need to be tied to hillside
- Anything over 4' needs to be engineered
- Joints need to be considered









#### Weed Fabric - Good idea or not?

- Weed control is for a limited amount of time.
- Slopes pose issues for holding mulch.
- Water infiltration diminishes over time.
- Woven vs. Non-Woven









# Amending soil to save water, bucks and energy

- Start with smaller plants
- Use lots of compost and mulch
- Amend soil, or haul in new soil








#### Keep Those Trees Alive

- Do not 'Volcano' mulch
- Pay attention to the root collar

#### **Establishment to Established**

- Cut down on irrigation slowly.
- Remove staking.
