10 college interns

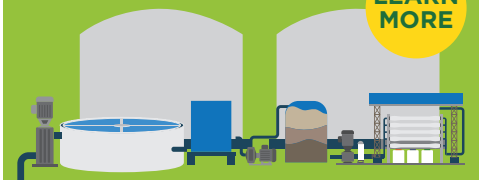

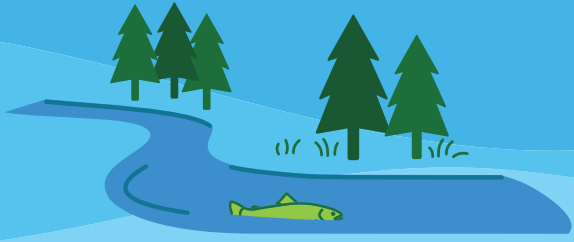

Trees contribute to carbon sequestration, forest health, restoration, and improved wildlife habitats.
